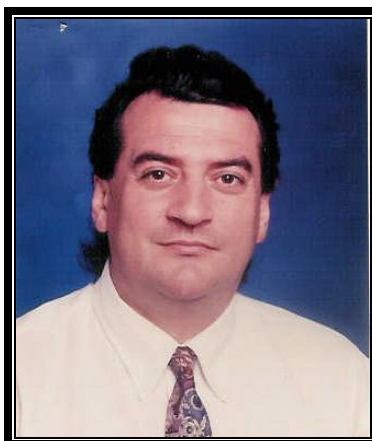


Professor



Dan Petrescu

Education:

- **Born in Bucharest, Romania Dan Petrescu began his musical education at age 5 learning to play piano and accordion.**
- **He later attended the George Enescu Magnet School where he graduated Magna cum Lauda in violoncello performance.**
- **Professor Petrescu continued his musical education by earning a P.H.D. in cello performing art at "Ciprian Porumbescu "University in Bucharest Romania and a Masters in Education at A.I.U. Weston, Florida.**

Experience:

- **Professor Petrescu was the winner of the Cello Competition while earning his P.H.D. at the Conservatory Ciprian Porumbescu and has performed as a Cello soloist with the Radio-Television Orchestra from Bucharest and with this same orchestra performed in the U.R.S.S. Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland, East Germany and Czechoslovakia.**
- **As the winner of the 1980 Cello Soloist Competition at the Maracaibo Symphony Orchestra in Venezuela, he went on to perform in over 22 countries including Mexico, Canada, Italy and more than 60 concerts in United States with this same orchestra.**
- **In 1990 Professor Petrescu wins the Cello Soloist Competition at the Miami Symphony Orchestra where he performed in over 150 concerts in Miami, Florida and Carnegie Hall, New York.**
- **Prof. Petrescu is a music teacher in the Miami Dade County Public School System, teaching music theory, music appreciation, strings orchestra (violin, viola, cello, double bass) guitar and beginners/intermediate piano.**

- In his musical career Professor Petrescu was the Dean of string teachers in Venezuela and Romania.
- Professor Petrescu and his wife Cornelia, an accomplished musician, professor and judge in her own right, formed the Amadeus Musical Center in Venezuela, where more than 300 young performers in piano, electronic keyboard, all strings and guitar attended.
- In Miami, Florida they opened the "Petrescu Music Conservatory" where they have been educating young talents in piano and string instruments for over 15 years.
- Professors Petrescu and Cornelia have performed over 150 recitals / concerts in chamber music as Trio Lipatti, together with different violinists and musicians.
- Both Professors have participated in International competitions as judges in cello and piano at Bayreuth -Germany, Nice -France, Milano, Notto, Palermo, Napoli, Trevi, Rome, and Firenze Italy. In the U.S. they participated at the International Music Instrumental Music Competition in Phoenix, Arizona and are now Founding Members, Professors and Judges of Stage Masters Music Competitions.
